But what about identities, as they get carried across continents? How do we cope with them? And do the cultures interact, as they suddenly move closer? Do they clash as Huntington predicted? Or might there be a common ground? What is the role of religion in this process? Where do politics enter? And what part do I play - today and in the future?

These are the questions the international seminar co-organized by the Young European Movement Berlin Brandenburg and JEF Europe will be tackling. 45 young Europeans will meet from 18 to 23 March 2007 in Berlin. They gather in this city of 184 nationalities for hands-on multicultural experiences and an intercultural learning process. The seminar in the framework of the Council of Europe's "all equal, all different"-campaign will consist of many excursions and interactive sessions, in which participants will be asked to discover their own as well as unknown cultural identities.

Arrival: Sunday, 18 March 2007, afternoon

Departure: Friday, 23 March 2007, early afternoon

Registration fee: 100 EUR per participant to be paid upon receipt of confirmation

Included: Hostel accommodation and all meals, materials and excursions as in the seminar program

Travel reimbursement: 70% of your travel costs up to 230 EUR will be reimbursed during the seminar
